#### Starlight Stadium: List of Badges

The full list of badges explains the achievements and awards students can collect in each episode and their connection to the learning objectives. They also entail potential for discussion and comparison, encouraging players to reflect on their choices and how those choices align with the objectives.

Each badge has its own **name**. Before the badge is earned, players are given a hint through a **pre-description** framing the challenge. The **post-description** appears after earning the badge, explaining the achievement and reinforcing the **applicable learning objective**.
